The expected progress from KS1 to KS2 for these pupils was 100% in reading and writing and 94% for maths. There was an upward trend in the value added progress measure in Maths, Reading and Writing with the school performing higher than the National figure in writing.

The school continues to work on narrowing the gap in Maths and the percentage of level 5.
